John, thanks again for herding us along.... Sarah (and all FYI), attached are some of the CJP climate litigation slides I mentioned, maybe the beginnings of what an overview piece could look like.

Further culling may be needed — this has the trend graphic we mentioned (slide 3), but mindful of Becky's point about the absolute case numbers, I wonder if the state-by-state map (slide 4) is even more important? And I'm questioning whether we'd want the separate slide about the Multnomah County case (slide 11); it may be enough that it gets mentioned on slide 8....

Likewise, some Oregon-specific expansion is needed, both responsive to the science topics Erica covers and whatever common-law issues you want to address. But it's a starting point, I'll do some tailoring of my own and will be happy to accept any additions/deletions/edits others might suggest.
