I think the presentation went very well. As you know, Jay presented along with Dr. Fleishman and Professor Adams-Shoen. They did an excellent job presenting a neutral, informative, and useful overview of climate-related litigation. I am confident that the presentation helped increase the attendees' understanding of the variety of climate-related cases that are likely to come to state courthouses and the legal issues that arise in those cases. By providing an overview, the presentation served to alert the judges to developments in the area of law. It also helpfully pointed them to resources (including the CJP's educational modules).

The conference was the annual judicial conference for Oregon's state judges. There were 242 judges registered to attend the conference in person. The conference was also webcast. The registered in-person attendees were

164 circuit court judges (out of 179)  
1 tax court judge (out of 1)  
12 Court of Appeals judges (out of 13)  
7 Supreme Court judges (out of 7)  
58 senior judges (out of 193)

For a total of 242 (out of 393).

Our presentation was a plenary session (not a break-out session). It was, however, at 8:00 am, so we did not have all of the in-person attendees with us.

I was particularly pleased that, after the presentation, several people came up to speak to our presenters. If I heard correctly, some of those people want to learn more and may be extending invitations for future presentations or other opportunities.

I've asked the conference organizers for an attendance list and will send it along if they provide it.

I know the conference planners are still soliciting evaluations. I'll send those along when I receive them.
