## CLIMATE SCIENCE AND LAW FOR JUDGES WEBSITE AND CURRICULUM BY THE NUMBERS

The Climate Judiciary Project (CJP) collaborates with leading climate scientists and legal scholars to meet judges' need for basic familiarity with climate science methods and concepts.

In 2023, CJP developed and disseminated the first 13 modules of the Climate Science and Law for Judges curriculum to provide neutral, objective information to the judiciary about the science of climate change as it is understood by the expert scientific community and relevant to current and future litigation.

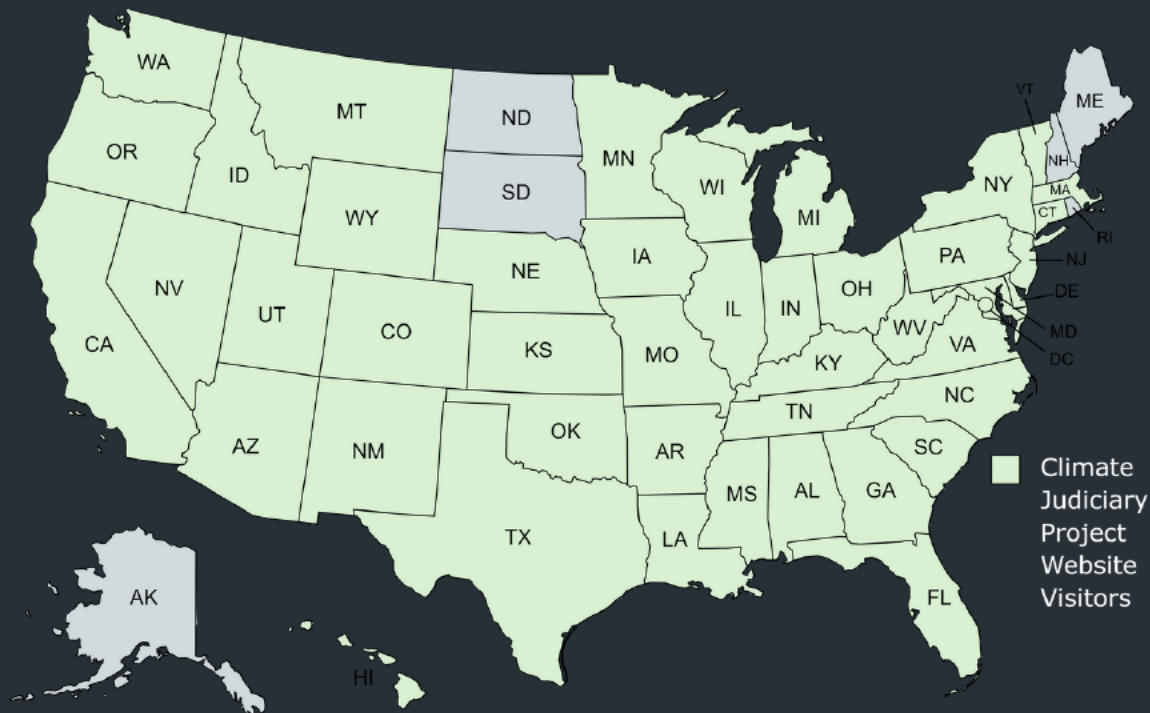

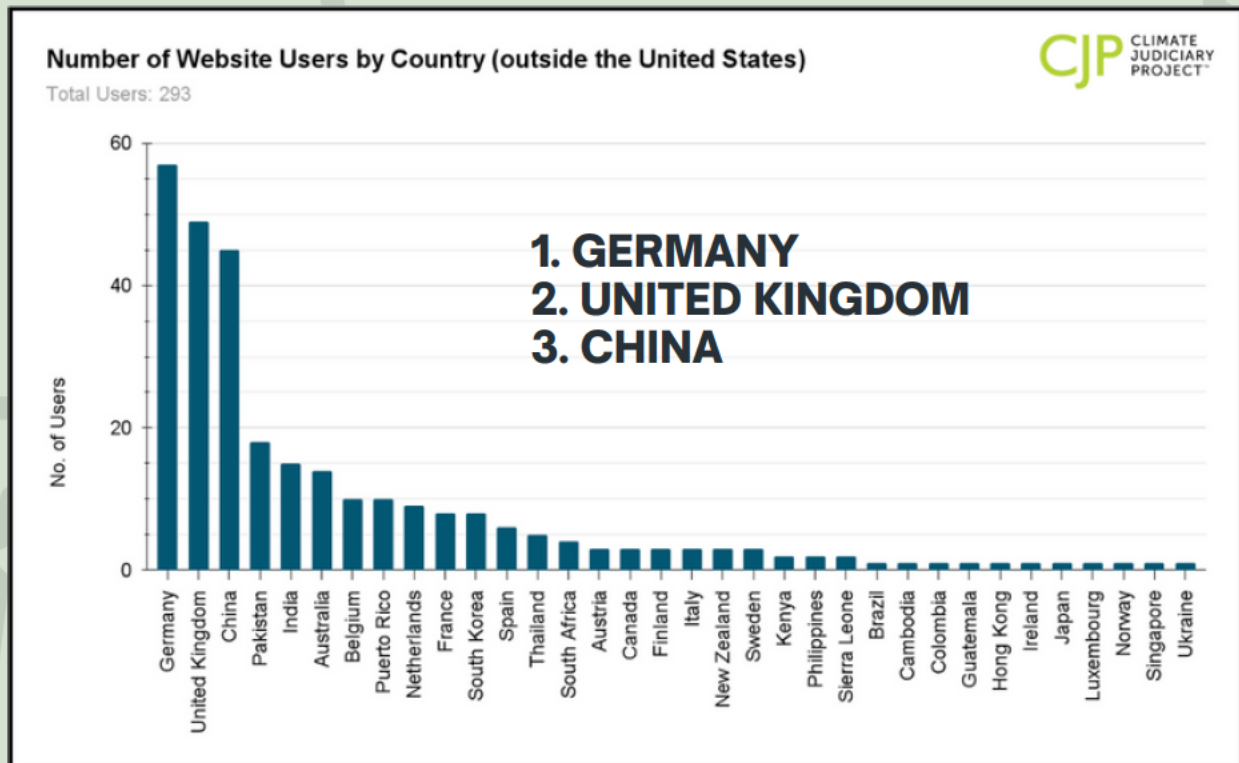

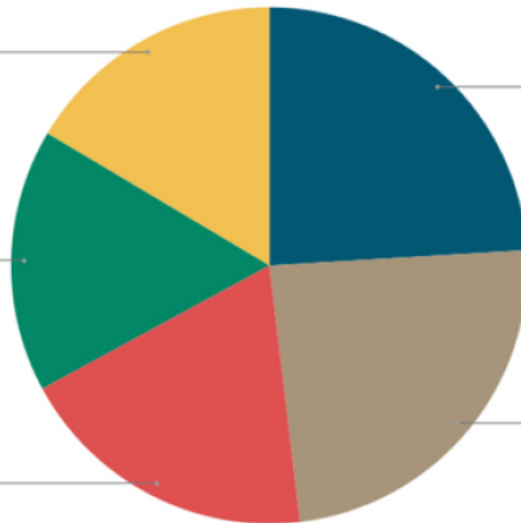

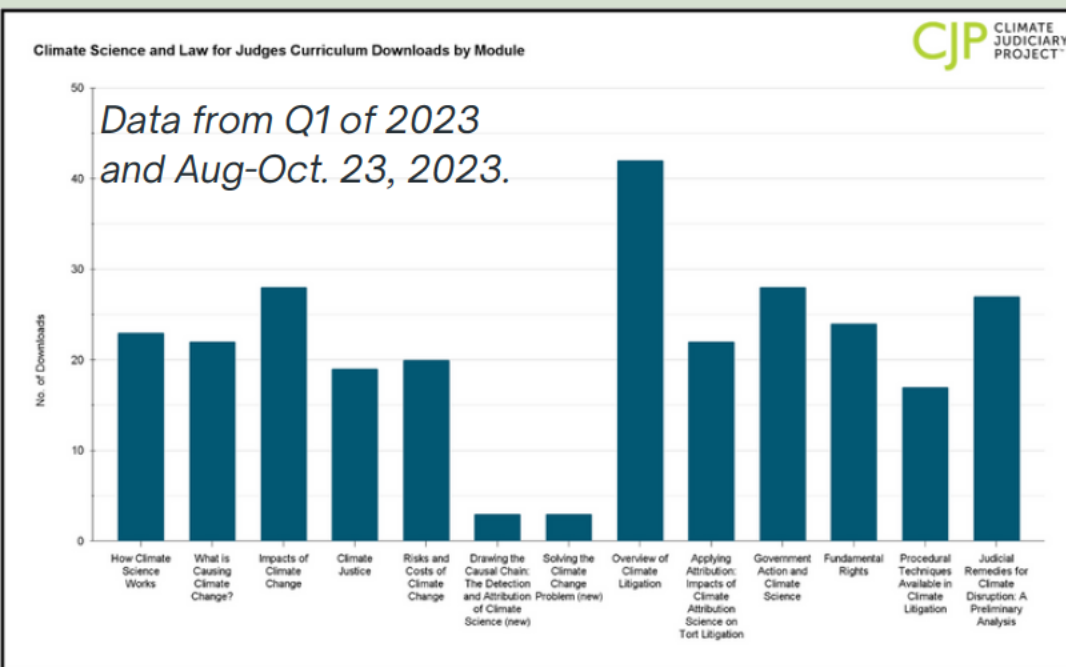

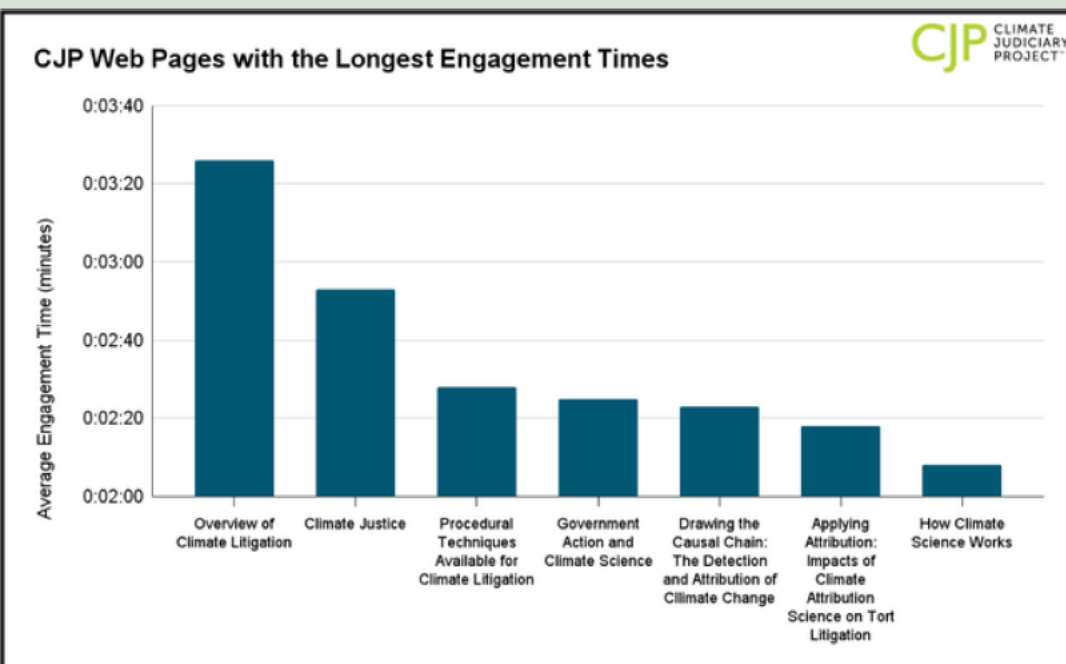

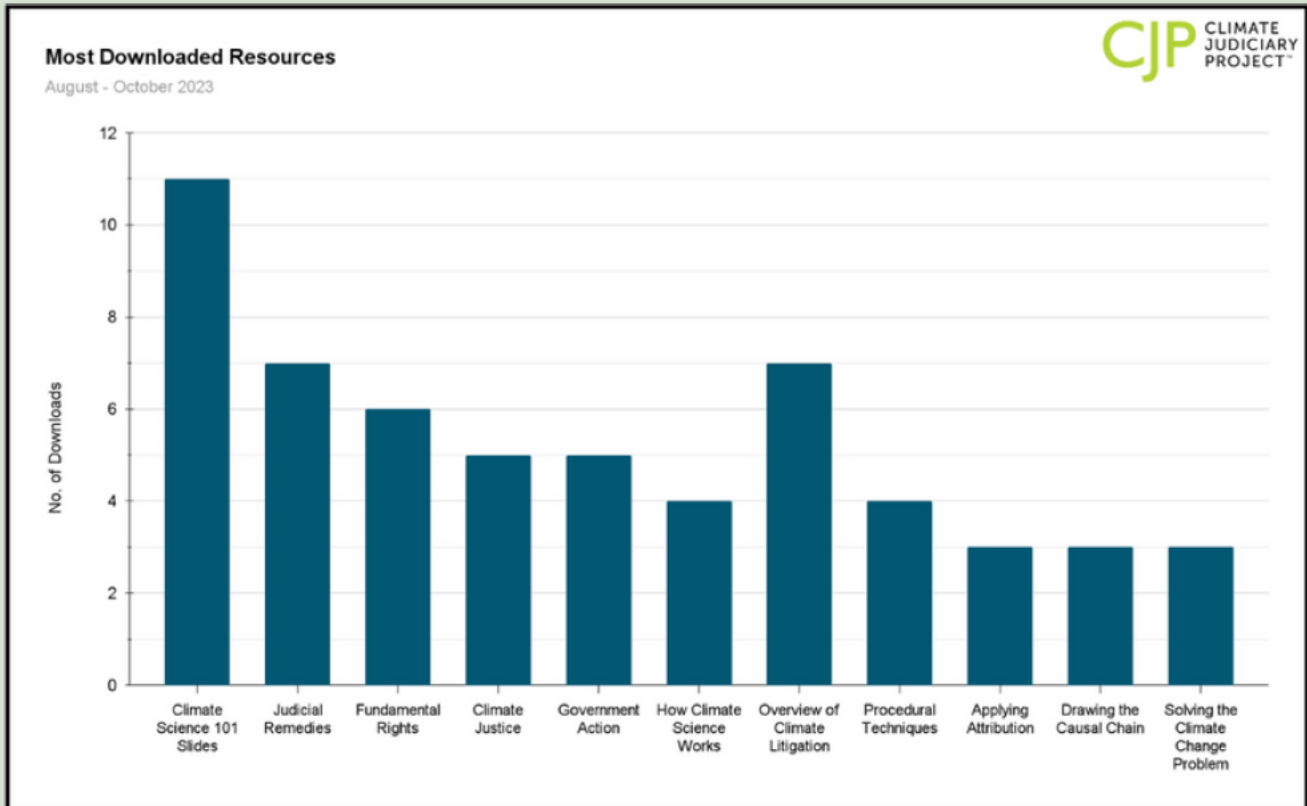
