



Climate Science and Law for Judges is a comprehensive resource designed to provide judges and the judiciary with reliable information about the legal and scientific issues in climate litigation.


CLIMATE CASES OVER TIME

ADAPTATION & RISK MANAGEMENT


cases involve financial, physical, and other risks posed by a changing climate

Utility negligence for wildfires (foreseeable heat, drought, wind)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• CA lawsuits led to PG&E bankruptcy• PacifiCorp class action in Oregon• Upcoming Lahaina cases in Hawaii
State-law suits against fossil-fuel companies for damages (tort/consumer protection claims)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• CA, MD; Boulder, Honolulu; Multnomah Cty.• Pacific Coast crab fishers• Cases starting to proceed in state courts
Challenges to energy projects (both fossil-fuel and renewable)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Permitting, zoning and land use• Wildlife and ecosystem impacts• Utility law and rate-setting
State constitutional suits for injunctive and declaratory relief	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Held v. State of Montana• Navahine F. v. Hawai'i Dept. of Transportation• [D. Or. <i>Juliana</i> case as federal analogue]
