I'm excited to promote a new database, [Redline—Research Database for Litigation Against New Fossil Fuel Extraction](#). The purpose of Redline is to help environmental NGOs and public-interest lawyers address questions of fact that commonly arise in legal challenges against new fossil fuel projects. The database will also be a useful resource for journalists and researchers working on fossil fuel-related issues in the context of the climate crisis.

Redline contains key scholarly research papers and reports relevant to these issues. Each article/report has its own page with an easily digestible summary that also highlights potential applications of the research in fossil fuel litigation. On the platform, the articles and summaries are organised into browsable categories covering factual issues commonly arising in fossil fuel-related litigation. Each category has its own landing page describing the issue and introducing the relevant articles in the database.

Redline is the product of a project I co-led with my UCL colleague, Dr Steve Pye (UCL Energy Institute), and funded by UCL Grand Challenges. We are grateful for the support of our project partners: EarthJustice; Friends of the Earth UK; Uplift; and the Climate Litigation Network.
