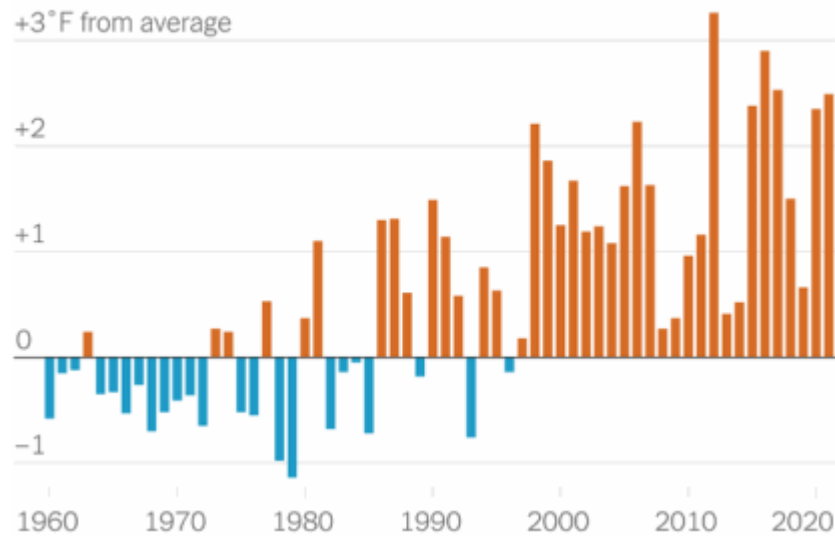


Surface temperature anomalies in the U.S.



The younger generations are growing up where there is no normal," University of Washington public health and climate scientist Kristie Ebi said, pointing out that there have been 406 consecutive months when the world was warmer than the 20th century average. (Nov 2018)

Antarctica has lost nearly 3 trillion tons of ice since 1992, enough to cover Texas nearly 13 feet (4 meters) deep, scientists reported in June. Greenland has lost more than 5 trillion tons in the same period.

Melting in Antarctica and Greenland in the last few years "literally doubled our projections of the sea level rise at the end of this century," said Dr. Michael Mann of Penn State. (Nov 2018)
