Dear Chief Justice Beasley:

I missed seeing you in Honolulu at the CCJ Midyear meeting. As you know CCJ's educational program was on climate science and some of you expressed interest in providing training to state trial judges on this topic. I hope you can help identify a judge from your state to receive such training.

The National Judicial College is working with the Environmental Law Institute on a Climate Judiciary Project seeking feedback from judges about needs for educational programs and materials related to climate science. We would like you to recommend one state judge to attend our upcoming pilot seminar to be held in Atlanta on March 13, at Georgia Tech. The project will cover meals, lodging and travel costs for attendance.

We have been doing the sessions for regional audiences across the country and would very much value the participation and insights of state judges from the Southeast. We will use the lessons from these pilots to expand our program to an operational phase. This is the final in our pilot series. A copy of the agenda from our most recent program is Chicago and a draft outline for the course in Atlanta is attached for your review.

We would appreciate a nomination by February 24th. If there is any further information about this program that we could provide, please let us know.
