As you may recall from the Regional Conservation Forum in DC, the Environmental Law Program (ELP) at the William S. Richardson School of Law, in collaboration with IUCN Hawaii Hui members and friends, has been working on motions for the 2020 IUCN World Conservation Congress.

The four draft Motions (attached here) address four topics of global importance that are also of particular interest to Hawai'i and the Pacific: (1) Impacts of Sunscreen to Coral Reefs; (2) Marine Plastic Pollution; (3) Oil Pollution from Sunken Vessels; and (4) Climate Change.
