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For Rio

As I mentioned, one idea is to think about interventions and presentations that help to launch initiatives. These can engage academics, practitioners, and decisionmakers to help develop concrete approaches grounded in evidence, learning, and best practice.

Along those lines, ELI has been working with UNEP and others to develop a session on environmental rule of law. We would like to propose a **panel on tracking environmental rule of law** that would first share the results of UNEP's *First Global Report on the Environmental Rule of Law* (Elizabeth Mrema or Arnold Kreilhuber), then present the proposed Global Index on the Environmental Rule of Law that will be the basis for subsequent reports (Andy Raine and Carl Bruch), have comments from a couple of partner institutions (such as Victor Mosoti, World Bank, and Claudia de Windt, OAS), then have a discussion particularly around the Index, its indicators, and potential data sources. [We have not yet had the chance to ask Victor or Claudia about participating in this event, but I did not want to delay sending this to you.]

I also have a few ideas for specific presentations:

- Judge Merideth Wright could give a presentation on **"Supervising Judicial Remedies"**, which would explore ways that judges can draft judgments and then supervise them to ensure the remedies are fulfilled in the real world. This probably would fit best under 4(b).
- Jay Pendergrass could give a presentation on **"Environmental Liability"**, which would showcase some of the innovative work we have been doing in Indonesia (and elsewhere). This would probably fit best under 4(c), but 4(b) could also work.
- **Scott Fulton** is happy to participate in whatever way you think most appropriate.

One final idea for Rio ... it might be interesting to have someone give a presentation on gender aspects. Maybe gender and environmental rule of law. I am seeing a growing body of discussion in environmental management on gender. Historically, much of that discourse has focused on women as victims and women as vulnerable populations that need to be protected. Increasingly, though, there is a growing emphasis on women's agency to effect change and good governance. While there are many legal dimensions, I have not seen much discussion in environmental law circles on this. The World Environmental Law Congress would be a wonderful place to rectify the omission.

For Marseille

ELI and UNEP are developing a proposal for a panel on the environmental rule of law at the World Conservation Congress (please see attached). We are keen to engage partners. Toward that end, we would like to explore whether you or someone else in the Commission would like to participate. We plan to submit the proposal on the 16th. We are also reaching out to Victor and Claudia also.
