Dear Colleagues – I’m pleased to announce this year’s winners of the Environmental Law and Policy Annual Review (ELPAR) process. Summaries of the ELPAR winners will be published in the August 2020 Environmental Law Reporter, along with the abstracts from the honorable mention selections. The winning articles will also be the subject of conferences in DC and Nashville.

As in prior years, these articles were selected based on the strength of their law and policy proposals. We know that this is a deeply subjective process, but we hope that ELPAR selection will create incentives for all of us to include viable proposals in academic articles. The process involved a review of the 300+ academic environmental law articles published between August 1, 2018 and July 31, 2019, and it included input from an outside expert advisory board (including NGO, corporate, and government attorneys, with Jim Salzman representing the academy), ELI staff, and the students in the ELPAR class at Vanderbilt.
