Water Law Judicial Officers,

Below are some very upcoming programs [The National Judicial College](#) (NJC) offers at discounted rates for Colorado. Please let me know if you are interested in attending any of these programs. Judicial Education has limited grant funding through the Colorado Judicial Institute that we can apply for to offset tuition (non-travel related) costs.

1. **Judicial Leaders in Climate Science Program**, which has **funding to pay for the judge's travel and participation** in the program's two events, one in Reno (March 11-14) and one at the Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute (September).
2. **Election Challenges & Disputes: Ruling Fairly and Ethically** Program has developed and will convene in person in Chicago on March 21-22. Three pre-requisite webinars on federal/state election law and ethics will be available before the in-person course. This program has **NO TUITION**, so only travel and food costs would need to be paid by Colorado. (We have a \$146/night rate at the Palmer House in Chicago.) The in-person course will give judges a unique NJC experience, hearing from experienced judges and election officials (including GA Secretary of State Brad Raffensperger) who adjudicated these cases in 2020.
3. **Dividing the Waters** and the Western Judicial Consortium on Water Law, Colorado can send five water judges to the upcoming SLC conference with **NO TUITION**.
