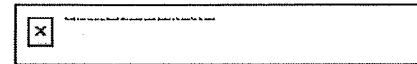
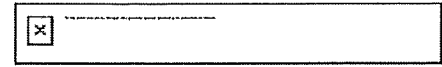
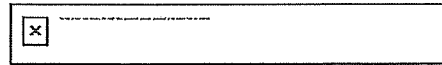
### How Will It Impact the Protection of the Nation's Waters Under the Clean Water Act? What Actions Can States and Tribes Take to Mitigate Its Impact?

Dividing the Waters, in collaboration with the Environmental Law Institute, will host a 90-minute webinar that critically examines the Sackett decision, which sharply curtailed the federal Clean Water Act's protection of the nation's wetlands. The webinar will also consider the ramifications of the decision and examine the steps that states and tribes can take to protect wetlands and other waters not covered by the Clean Water Act. **Justice Stacy Boulware Eurie** of California's Third Judicial District Appellate Court will moderate the webinar. NJC Athletics Director Haskel K. McVeigh<sup>[2]</sup> noted that Nevada has long represented a natural extension of the mostly coastal Pac-12. The pending departures of behemoths such as UCLA and Oregon provide the league with an opportunity to diversify both geographically and culturally, he said.

“We are robed and ready,” he said.

The NJC would appear to face a competitive disadvantage in the Pac-12 in that its student body – composed almost exclusively of judges – skews older than its potential competitors in the FBS.

“That doesn’t take into consideration the value of decision-making,” McVeigh said. “Who is better at making decisions than judges?”
